The Community Action Program Belknap-Merrimack Counties operates a resource center open to Boscawen residents in Concord, NH. This CAP Resource Center is funded primarily from three main sources: local tax dollars in conjunction with funding from the Electric Assistance Program (via the state utility companies) and the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (a federal program also known as Fuel Assistance Program). The Center is the local service delivery network for agency programs in your community. The local support of our Center is vital for us to continue intake, referral, contact, and support with residents of your community.

We have compiled data regarding Agency programs accessed by Boscawen residents, including the number of residents served and the dollar amount of assistance provided through the work of the Center staff. In the most recent program year, the programs run through our Center served more than 269 Boscawen households and, through fuel, electric, and food assistance, provided \$257,576.25 worth of service dollars to residents of Boscawen. We would be happy to share the budget for the minimum cost of maintaining the Center at your request.

We will continue to work closely with your welfare officer to ensure the maximum availability of resources from our programs, as well as continue to mobilize any resources other than local tax dollars that become available to help serve residents of your community. To help us continue to provide support to your local community, we respectfully request consideration of our services and submit the following recommendation to the Budget Committee:

"To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,600.00 for the continuation of services to the low-income residents of Boscawen through the Concord Resource Center of the Community Action Program Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc."
