# **Boscawen Transfer Station & Recycling Center**

36 Marlboro Road

Year Around: Wednesdays & Saturdays 7:30-3:30 April through October: Tuesdays 2:30-7:00

- 1) The Transfer Station is for the use of the residents and businesses of the Town of Boscawen only.
- 2) A permit (Dump Sticker) is <u>required</u> for the use of the Transfer Station.
  - The Sticker can be obtained from the Town Clerk and should be affixed to the driver's side bottom of the windshield.
  - If you don't qualify for a Dump Sticker, then a temporary paper permit is issued from the Town Clerk. (Examples would include contractors or resident's borrowing vehicles.)
- 3) The Transfer Station accepts household trash, recycling, yard debris and construction/demolition debris.
- 4) Building "A" has the trash hoppers (compactors) and the Transfer Station Office.
  - All household trash goes in the hoppers.
  - Any questions and all disposal fees are paid in the office.
- 5) Building "B" (Recycling Building) is located across from Building A and has receptacles for recycling glass, cardboard, paper and all mercury containing devices.
  - The glass bin is in the middle of Building B against the back wall and is for bottles and jars only. Lids and labels are fine; please rinse if possible. Glass is comingle, which means you don't have to separate by color or type.
  - The cardboard bin is a red free standing box located in the middle of Building B. Only corrugated cardboard is accepted here. Wet, dirty or oily cardboard is not recyclable. All cardboard should be flattened and cut if necessary. Examples would be shipping boxes and pizza boxes.
  - Paper bins are the gray colored little dumpsters located on the left hand side of Building B. All paper goes here. Paper is co-mingle, so separating different types of paper is not necessary. Please bag shredded paper. Examples are newspaper, magazines and beer, soda and cereal boxes.
  - Mercury devices go in the barrel and the boxes located just to the right of the Cardboard Bin. It's against the law to dispose of any mercury in any place other than right here. Examples include fluorescent light bulbs and thermostats.
     Regular incandescent light bulbs do not go here. Since they contain no mercury they are safe to be disposed of in your household trash. Even though we are charged for disposing, we do not charge you.

#### 6) Plastic

• The Plastic Box is a red free standing box located right after Building B. The box is mainly for bottles and jars, but if the plastic item possesses a recycle symbol with a number 1-7 in it, it is recyclable. Labels and lids are ok. Please rinse if possible. Plastic is co-mingling.

## 7) Cans

- The Can Box immediately follows the Plastic Box. This box is for aluminum and steel cans only. All other metal objects go in the Metal Box. Like with the plastic and glass, cans are co-mingling, labels and lids are ok and rinsing is highly recommended as it cuts down the bees, hornets and bugs.
- 8) Building "C" contains our cardboard storage area and the Treasure House.
  - The Treasure House is a "swap shop." Unwanted good/working items can be left here for re-using. Examples include dishes, pots, pans, books, toys and games. Electronics are not allowed here; working or not. All furniture left here needs to be inspected by an Attendant. Clothes can be left in the white box located just outside the Treasure House.

# 9) Refrigerators

- They can be left in the Refrigerator Area located just to the left of the Treasure House.
- The doors must be removed and contents cleaned out. The metal doors and metal
  pieces go in the Metal Box and the other non metal pieces can be disposed of in
  the Furniture Box.
- There is a disposal fee for the Freon recovery.

## 10) Metal Box

- The Metal Box is located at the end of the dirt ramp which is located behind the Transfer Station Office (Building A).
- All metal items and metal appliances except refrigerators, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, water dispensers and microwaves go here.
- There are disposal fees for most of the items, so please see an Attendant.
- Propane and helium tanks, along with fire extinguishers have a place on the back side of the dirt ramp on the pallets. There also is a disposal fee.

#### 11) Furniture Box

- The Furniture Box is located next to the dirt ramp by the Metal Box. All upholstered furniture including couches, love seats, box springs, mattresses and recliners go here.
- There are disposal fees for all furniture. Please see an Attendant.

#### 12) Brush

• Brush can be left at the burn pit which is located behind the Transfer Station Office (Building A).

- All brush needs to be five (5) inches in diameter or smaller per Department of Environmental Services regulations.
- Clean wood is also accepted here.
- Pressure treated, painted, stained, varnished, pressboard, plywood and OSB is not accepted here; it is not considered clean wood and has to go out to the Construction/Demolition Debris Landfill.

## 13) Compost & Landfill

- Both are located on the dirt road just to the right of Building C.
- Stay straight at the fork and the compost piles are up on the left. Composting items include lawn clippings and pine needles.
- The landfill is past the compost piles up the hill. All construction and demolition goes here. Examples include treated wood, shingles and sheetrock.
- There are disposal fees for the landfill. Please see an Attendant as use of the Demo Scale may need to be utilized. The scale is located right before the recycling building (Building B).

## 14) Air Conditioners, Dehumidifiers and Water Dispensers

- Both are accepted and can be disposed of on a pallet located right after the Transfer Station office (Building A).
- Like refrigerators, there is a fee is assessed for the Freon recovery.

# 15) Cooking Oil

- All cooking oil is accepted and can be left at the cooking oil barrel which is right after the air conditioner pallet.
- Examples include peanut, olive, vegetable, sunflower, corn and soy oils. Lard is not accepted.

## 16) Electronics Box

- The Electronics Box is a red covered free standing box located right after the vegetable oil barrel. All electronics must go in the Electronics Box. It is against the law to dispose of any electronics with a screen with your household trash.
- Electronic items include TV's, computers, printers, VCR's, DVD players and microwaves.
- There are disposal fees, so please see an Attendant.

### 17) Used Motor Oil & Filters

- Immediately following the Electronics Box is the Filter Box and Used Motor Oil Tank.
- The Filter Box is a red free standing box and the oil tank follows the Filter Box.
- Both can be left at its respective places and will be disposed of by an Attendant.
- Antifreeze is not accepted at the Transfer Station unless there is a Household Hazardous Waste Day. This is the only exception.
